Challenges to achievement that we have identified among our disadvantaged pupils that will be addressed through the school-led tutoring grant

Challenges to be	
addressed by	
school:	

- 60% of disadvantaged children are not yet achieving ARE in reading and writing.
- 80% of disadvantaged children are not reaching ARE in maths.
- In reading and writing, 30% of disadvantaged children are not making at least expected progress.
- In maths, 40% of disadvantaged children are not making at least expected progress.
- Missed education due to lack of engagement and absence during periods of remote learning.
- Low confidence and low self-esteem.
- Poor engagement and low attendance at school during periods of remote learning.
- Continued disruption due to covid related absences.

Intended Outcomes

- Children to make accelerated progress and reach ARE by the end of the academic year.
- Opportunities for greater levels of interaction and feedback to encourage improved engagement in their learning.
- Support for pupils to overcome barriers to learning and increase their access to the curriculum.
- Sessions accurately targeted at individual children's specific needs.
