We value the importance of reading, so that all children can access the whole school curriculum.

English Curriculum

- Spoken language
- Reading word and comprehension
- Writing transcription and composition
- Grammar, spelling and punctuation

Our English curriculum is text based, children are read to daily and are taught the skills to read at least three times a week.

NB: may also be referred to as the Rapid Catch-Up programme

Decoding

 Being able to decode quickly in your head to allow the flow of reading.

Prosody

Being able read with expression.

Comprehension

 Being able to understand what you have just read.

Accelerated reading

For those children who are fluent readers.

Assessment ZPD

 At least every term the children complete an online assessment which gives them a zone of proximal development. Reading material that your child is able to complete independently.

Quiz

- Books should be kept for at least one week and no longer than four weeks.
- Online quizzes are then taken to see to what extent they understood the book.
- Pick next book.

Whole Class guided reading

All learners.

VIPERS

Comprehension skills that teach:

- Vocabulary
- Inference
- Prediction
- Explanation
- Retrieval
- Summary or Sequence

At home


Children should bring home:

- Reading for pleasure book (to be shared with an adult, beyond their ZPD)
- 2) A fluency book that they can read to an adult that has been matched to their reading ability through rigorous assessment.

Fluency books should be read at least 3 times a week at home.

Phonics to Spelling

Spelling shed - new programme September 2022. It uses phonic knowledge to break down words.



Phonics to Spelling

Children in Year 1 and 2 use a grow the code chart to help break down words into the correct grapheme (the correct letters to make that word e.g. N/igh/t the sound in the middle is an I sound but spelt 'igh').
